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**BODYVOX PERFORMS THE PHILLY PREMIERE OF
WATER BODIES, A MULTIMEDIA EXTRAVAGANZA
OCTOBER 22-24, 2009**

Philadelphia, PA –Known for its bold athleticism, physical humor and breathtaking theatricality, BodyVox hits the City of Brotherly Love this fall with *Water Bodies*, a full-length Philadelphia premiere, as part of the Dance Celebration Series at the Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts, 3680 Walnut Street, Philadelphia, PA.

Conceived and choreographed by BodyVox Artistic Directors Jamey Hampton and Ashley Roland, former alums of MOMIX, Pilobolus and ISO, and Emmy Award-winners for performance in Los Angeles-based KCET television production *Episodes*, *Water Bodies* uses water as a metaphor, medium and trigger point as a harbinger of disaster and hope. *Dance Magazine* praises BodyVox's *Water Bodies* as "sidesplittingly funny and magnificently danced." This mixed media production features 12 dance sections and two dance- for-camera films, including the visually-stunning and hilarious *Metamorphishes* by award-winning filmmaker Mitchell Rose in collaboration with Roland.

Under the artistic direction of Randy Swartz, **Dance Celebration, presented by Dance Affiliates and the Annenberg Center's Penn Presents**, maintains the tradition of bringing to Philadelphia the world's best contemporary touring dance companies. This season's theme, **The Magic of Movement**, pays tribute to American dance and showcases its diversity of styles, from tap and Broadway to jazz, contemporary, hip-hop, multimedia and dance theater.

Performances will take place on Thursday, October 22 at 7:30 pm; Friday, October 23 at 8:00 pm and Saturday, October 24 at 2:00 pm and 8:00 pm. 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Sections titled “The Big Dip,” “Catch of the Day,” “Fishers are Men,” “Water Body” and “The Final Wave” underscore *Water Bodies*’ overarching theme. Moving from the comic to the serious, “Water Body” is a solo for the uproarious Hampton prancing, grimacing and gesturing in—and around—a claw-footed bath tub. “S.O. S.,” a compelling ensemble section filled with seamlessly inverted lifts and tender partner work, set to Lowell Mason’s “Nearer My God to Thee” and Jean Sibelius’ “Valse Triste,” addresses hope and salvation. In contrast, set to the music of the Sex Mob, “Catch of the Day” is a playful belly-laugh-inducing parody featuring fishermen Jamey Hampton and Eric Skinner in thigh-high wader boots catching the sumptuous and deadpan Ashley Roland in a scuba suit. “Airborne” highlights the relationship of the two artistic directors in a moving duet. Interspersed in the production is live video feed and two short dance films. The work closes with “The Final Wave,” an electrifying full-ensemble piece set to Michael Torke’s “White Pages.”

Founded in 1997 to fulfill a commission from the Portland Opera, BodyVox is dedicated to the creation of multidisciplinary dance works that entertain, inspire and uplift audiences of all ages. Known for its inventive approaches and “freewheeling movement style” (as described by *The Oregonian*), the Company’s movement sources stem from years of cross-training imbued with a curiosity and fascination with the endless possibilities of the human body in motion. Artistic Directors Jamey Hampton and Ashley Roland (partners, longtime collaborators and distinguished dance theater artists) choreographed and performed with the innovative dance companies MOMIX, ISO Dance and Pilobolus. BodyVox builds upon this tradition with its unique creative voice that is influenced by its Northwest roots. The company has choreographed two operas and created six original full-length works. BodyVox’s films have won numerous awards in national and international festivals. *Modern Daydreams*—composed of “Treadmill Softly,” “Islands in the Sky,” “Unleashed” and “Deere John”—won the prestigious American Choreography Award for Outstanding Achievement in Short Film in 2002.

In addition to performances, BodyVox will offer outreach activities including two master classes as part of the *Artist to Artist Series* and a special school performances as part of the Annenberg Center’s *Student Discovery Series*.
